### 1. To receive apologies for absence.

### 2. Declaration of Interest

3. To consider Amendment to Allotment Tenancy Agreement.

The committee recommended the following clause be included in the allotment tenancy 'To treat all Council staff with courtesy and respect. Verbal abuse or threats towards staff will not be tolerated and could lead to the tenancy being revoked'.

The committee recommended an additional clause be added to include to protect other tenants, contractors and Councillors from verbal abuse and threats. The wording would be brought back to Full Council.

# 4. To consider current process for evicting allotment tenants (Torts (Interference with Goods) Act 1977)

The committee recommended that an additional clause be added to the tenancy (if not already there) stating the length of time from the eviction date when all the tenants belonging should be removed.
