At the Annual Town Council Meeting held on Tuesday 21st May 2024 at the Memorial Hall, Dereham at 7.30pm.

14. Councillor P Duigan to speak on the 50th Anniversary of Dereham Town Council.

Councillor P Duigan explained that before becoming Dereham Town Council in 1974, the Council was known as the Urban District Council. The Urban District Council left a legacy of car parks, and Rashes Green Industrial Estate to Breckland District Council.

Councillor Duigan said that his father was the last Chairman on the Urban District Council and the first on Dereham Town Council and 1977 a Mayor was elected rather than a Chairman. Councillor Duigan said that there has been a Duigan on the council for 54 years.

Councillor Duigan mentioned some of Dereham Town Councils achievements which included the refurbishment of the War Memorial Hall, a new Cemetery, Skatepark, Countryside Park and playgrounds.

Councillor Duigan ended by saying that Dereham Town Council should be proud of what they have done and that they have conducted themselves in the main very well. 'Well done Dereham Town Council, here's to the next 50 years'
