At a meeting of the **Heritage & Open Spaces Committee** held on **Tuesday 27th June 2023** upon the rising of the Planning Committee.

1. To receive apologies for absence.

Apologies for absence were received from Councillors P Morton & H Jones-Seymour.

2. Declaration of Interest.

There were no declarations of interest.

3. To elect a Chairman.

Councillor L Monument proposed Councillor P Duigan, seconded by Councillor A Brooks. There were no other nominations. It was agreed that Councillor P Duigan be Chairman of the Heritage & Open Spaces Committee 2023/24.

4. To elect a Vice Chairman.

Councillor K Cogman proposed Councillor A Greenwood, seconded by Councillor L Monument. There were no other nominations. It was agreed that Councillor A Greenwood be Vice Chairman of the Heritage & Open Spaces Committee 2023/24.

5. To receive the Community Access Wardens report.

The Community Access Warden Mr Ken Hawkins presented his report to the committee.

6. To Consider a request from aboutDereham to agree wording on Brown Tourist signs.

The committee recommended that an application be made for each potential venue/attraction in order to understand which might be eligible for inclusion on a brown sigh. Mike Webb would complete each application, Town Clerk would approve before the applications are sent off.

7. **To consider revised plaque commemorating John Craske.**This item would be looked into by Councillors L Monument, P Duigan and C Coleman and bring a proposal back to Full Council after consulting with any remaining family members.

8. To consider legal action against Norfolk County Council over continued obstruction of RB3 and other public Rights of Way.

The committee recommended that a letter be prepared by the Town Council's solicitor making the case as to why the Council should act. The letter to be sent to Norfolk County Council.

- 10. To discuss transfer of the Neatherd Management responsibilities from Breckland Council to Dereham Town Council.
