At a meeting of the **Full Council** held on **Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> November 2024** in the Memorial Hall at **7.30pm**.

# 76. To receive apologies for absence.

Vanda Alexander expressed her concerns at the possible closure of Toftwood Medical centre, the impact to those registered there and the knock-on impact to services at Theatre Royal Surgery and Orchard Surgery.

District Councillor A Webb encouraged applications to the Household Support Fund. She asked that people made their views known on proposed car parking charge and provided the current position regarding the Akash.

PC Roger Benton gave a verbal update on current Dereham priorities - shop lifting and speeding - and arrests and prosecutions for vandalism in the town. PC Benton was asked for an update on a rise in anti-social behaviour in Dereham.

Councillor Z Flint raised concerns over the safety of vulnerable people in temporary accommodation in Dereham, paid for by Breckland Council. District Councillor A Webb would raise this with the relevant department.

# 78. To consider response to the consultation regarding the closure of Toftwood Medical Centre.

Councillor L Monument agreed that this agenda item could be brought forward.

Liz Feeke was permitted to voice her concern that getting appointments at Theatre Royal Surgery was already difficult and would only get worse if Toftwood patients were transferred there.

Councillors felt there had been a lack of forward planning by Norfolk & Waveney Integrated Care Board in view of the increase in new homes planned for Toftwood. Had other locations, such as Dereham Hospital, been considered? Councillor L Monument stated that the Town Council would support all attempts to keep Toftwood Medical Centre open, either at its current site or, without interruption, elsewhere in Toftwood.

Proposed by Councillor P Duigan, it was agreed that Dereham Town Council would write to the Secretary of State to review any decision to close Toftwood Medical Centre.

Councillor A Greenwood asked for an update on flooding in Toftwood. Councillor H Clarke and Councillor P Duigan would request updates and report back.

Councillors S Green and A Brooks asked about the future of the Fred Nicholson site once the school had moved to Swaffham. Councillor P Duigan was asked to enquire and report back.
